ANNUAL REPORT





What a strange and difficult year! This report highlights some of the achievements by our athletes during the last year. However, perhaps the biggest success for the club has been achieved through our officials. Shaftesbury Barnet Harriers hosted a ThrowsFest on 11 July at Barnet Copthall Stadium following the first lockdown; the first licensed athletics fixture in the UK. We had over 1600 participants at our 7 licensed meetings.

Training continued from June in compliance with the ever-changing guidelines. A big thank you to **JEREMY SOTHCOTT**, who has been managing the Coach/Athlete usage at Barnet Copthall Stadium.

At the National Young Athletes Road Relay our U17 Women's team of **EMILY HATHAWAY**, **FREYA STAPLETON** and **JOANNE MIRANDA** finished in 4th place.

At the National Men's 6 Stage our Senior Men's team JAKE SHELLEY, PHILLIP CROUT, LIAM DEE, DYLAN EVANS, MARK PEARCE and THOMAS BUTLER finished in 5th place.

Congratulations to **CLYDE GORDON** who at the England Athletics London Awards evening, received his well-earned Volunteer of the Year award. In a tight run vote **GEOFF MORPHITIS** was runner-up to **ANNE RODEN** in the Services to Athletics category.

CLYDE is a consummate team player and leads by example. **CLYDE** is a qualified coach and looks after our young throws squad (which includes significant BAME and women). He is a qualified field official and timekeeper and has been working with our photofinish team where his IT knowledge has been invaluable. **CLYDE** has team managed our successful boys YAL team, then the NJAL team and latterly the YDL team. The teams won a number of regional and national titles over the years. He was also a key member of the management team which took the successful SBH men's team into Europe at both Junior and Senior level. He also volunteered to manage the club team in the UKWAL team.

GEOFF joined SBH in 1964. He took up coaching in 1972 and became team manager (Division 5 Southern League) and has continued to the present time winning the BAL Premiership title in 2012 & 2013. He was a member of the BAL Finance committee and awarded life membership of the BAL. He became Club Treasurer in 1990 and remains so (nearly 30 years!). He was Club Chairman (1982-89) and Club President (1987-1990). In 2004 he led the team of Club officers in the successful bid for the five year management contract of Barnet Copthall Stadium. He was heavily involved with the redevelopment of Allianz Park into the first joint use facility for both athletics and Premiership Rugby. **GEOFF** was a founding member of the National Junior Athletic League and managed the SBH team to numerous victories with the Club representing GB&NI in Europe. He has organised the LICC series since inception in 2004. He was elected a member of the London Council of EA in 2007.

Southern Cross Country Relay Championships: U17 Women's team of **JOANNE MIRANDA**, **EMILY HATHAWAY** and **MAAYAN RADUS** took the Gold Medals. The U13 Boys team of **ZICO JONES**, **THOMAS CADWALLADER** and **GIANLEO STUBBS** won the Silver Medals.

National Cross Country Relay Championships: U20 Men's team of THOMAS PATRICK, JEREMY DEMPSEY and HENRY MCLUCKIE won the Gold Medal. There were Silver Medals from the U17 Women team of FREYA STAPLETON, EMILY HATHAWAY and JOANNE MIRANDA and our U13 Boys team of GIANLEO STUBBS, ZICO JONES and THOMAS CADWALLADER.

EDWIN YAMOAH won Silver Medals in the 100m and Long Jump and gold medals in 200m and 4x100m Relay (new World Record!) at the 10th World Transplant Games.

There were individually successes at the London Youth Games with a Silver Medal won by **GIANLEO STUBBS** U13 and Bronze Medals won by **ARTHUR PHILLIPS** U11, **ZICO JONES** U13, **SAMUEL GREENSTEIN** U15, **MUKHTAR MUSA** U17 and **MAAYAN RADUS** U17.

At the Scottish Senior Indoor Championships **LEWIS MCGUIRE** won the Gold Medal in the high jump and **ANGUS MCINROY** won the Gold Medal in the Shot 7.26kg with **KRISHAWN AIKEN** 400m winning the Silver Medal.

THOMAS PATRICK U20 (Loughborough University) won the Bronze Medal at the BUCS Cross Country Championships.

At the British Masters Indoor Championships—M45 **SEAN SUTHERLAND** won the Silver Medal in the 400m. W50 **LISA WEBB** won the Gold Medal in the 1500m and Bronze Medal in the 800m. In the 60m Hurdles – W35 **NENE HARRISON** won the Gold Medal and a further Gold in the Shot 4kg.

There were successes at the English Schools Cross Country Championships with top 20 finishes from **DAVID STONE** SB 4th, **FREYA STAPLETON** SG 9th, **KRISTIAN IMROTH** SB 10th **HENRY MCLUCKIE** SB 14th, **GIANLEO STUBBS** JB 14th and **KIT EVANS LOMBE** IB 14th.

At the Indoor Championships there were 6 Hertfordshire Champions and 15 Middlesex Champions, plus 5 Silver and 2 Bronze Medals.

The Covid pandemic lockdown prevented athletics training and did not allow any scope for competition. Training was permitted in June and arrangements for events were published and updated. The efforts of our coaches and athletes to keep the sport going demanded our best efforts to organise competitions even in the very disturbing times. On the first weekend permitted (11 July) SBH promoted a "ThrowsFest" at Copthall with two pools of 6 throwers in each throwing event. Compliance with Covid restrictions was achieved and the meeting went well with good performances by the athletes and enjoyment by the officials.

League competition had already been abandoned and Copthall was not available for competitions. Thus, we embarked on a series of LICC meetings at the Lee Valley Athletics Centre in partnership with the Achilles Club. Devising event arrangements was difficult. We had to deal with an "away" track, and with constantly changing restrictions. However, a successful series of 6 events over three weekends was held.

SBH were responsible for the meeting format and the officials while Achilles organised the entries and shared the meeting management. With restrictions on numbers we had Young Athletes on the Saturdays and Juniors and Seniors on the Sundays. It took 2 weekends to cover the full range of track and field events. There was a good attendance throughout and again the officials were happy to have come. Special mention should be made of the Young Athletes 4 x 100m Relay event run on behalf of UKA that we held when some one hundred teams from all over the country attended, and over a thousand people passed through the venue over the course of the day

We understand that our arrangements were used for other club promotions. Gratifyingly, there were no adverse effects from these events. We can take satisfaction that we led the promotion of meetings during a very traumatic summer. We had many comments of appreciation from athletes and coaches for our efforts and those of our many officials.

The 2020 outdoor season provided relatively few competition opportunities in these difficult times. Therefore, the Club Council have decided that there would be no Club Best Performance Awards for the year but to award medals to athletes who have produced top 6 age group rankings in 2020 as set out below. There were 6 new Club Records of which the most notable was the 1:44.83 in the Senior men's 800m by **KYLE LANGFORD** and on the women's side, **LIZZIE BIRD** who set a new record in the 2000m Steeplechase which was also the best ever by UK athlete.

At the Muller British Championships the club had 2 National Champions. **SCOTT LINCOLN** who had won the previous 5 Shot Put Championships back to 2015 and **NICK PERCY** in the Discus who retained the title he won last year. The Men retained their **ClubConnect** title being top point scorers.

There were Silver Medals for OJIE EDOBURUN (100m) LINA NIELSEN (400m Hurdles), MARK PEARCE (3000mS/C), DANIEL BAINBRIDGE (Javelin) CHRIS BENNETT (Hammer) and JADE LALLY (Discus). We also won 5 Bronze Medals from REBECCA JEGGO (200m), ELLIE BAKER (800m), HAYLEY MCLEAN (400m Hurdles), ETHAN WALSH (Pole Vault) and ANGELA BARRETT (Triple Jump).

On a sadder note Keith Moyse died in November 2019. Keith had organised our Young Athletes teams during the 1980 / 90's and taken them to the highest level where they have remained. During his tenure we were national champions 6 times, and won the European Championships which we hosted twice.

On behalf of the club we send our thanks and appreciation to all our Team Managers, Officials and helpers, for their contribution and professionalism throughout the year. Also, a big thank you to all the Parents who support their sons/daughters, week in, week out. Apologies if you have not been mentioned by name but I can assure you that our success during the last year has been due to the efforts of everyone. Good luck to you all in 2021.
